Good times on the tar sands bring increased GHG emissions and huge Provincial revenues but not prosperity



Weather? Climate? Do you know the difference?

This blog was inspired by Toronto's mild winter, which is the second warmest on record, the warmest winter being in the '90's. Here are some statistics about temperature



records taken from the National Climatic Data Center. Africa: 136° F, 1922. North America: 134° F, 1913. Asia: 129° F, 1942. Australia: 128° F, 1889. Europe: 122° F, 1881. South America: 120° F, 1905. Oceania: 108° F, 1912. Antarctica: 59° F, 1974. Based on record temperatures you might conclude that Global Warming was at its worst in Australia in 1889, and in North America (a temperature recording taken at Death Valley) in 1913. But it is not individual records on which the conclusion of global warming rests. It is the trend over a number of years, much like the trend Toronto has experienced. Walter Pitman reflects on these winter months of 2012 that are consistent with this trend.
